- Camp starts at 9:00 in the reception área of Sesimbra Natura Park and ends each day by 17h in the same place.
- The shullte bus leaves Lisbon at 8:30, so young adventurers should be there some time before. It returns to the same place around 18h.
- Young adventurers should bring with them a small backpack with personal items and gear for the day.



FOOD

All ingredientes and cooking equipment are provided by Escola do Mato but the meals will be made by the young adventurers. Always available during the day there is fresh fruit and snacks.

- **Day 2 –** Fish with veggies and fruit, all done on coals
- **Lesson Solution** Day 3 Fish bolognese with pasta
- **ODAY 4 –** Pork stew
- **B** Day 5 Special family barbecue, made by the students

We have dietary alternatives, from vegan to celiac, from kosher to halal.

FREQUENT QUESTIONS

•Who is the staff? What experience do they have?

Our staff and monitors have several years of experience with Escola do Mato, experience with working with youngsters either in summer camps or the scouts, having a clean criminal record and youth pedagogy training.


•How do you ensure safety during activities?

Besides our strict safety rules with cutting tools, there is a monitor at all times with each team of 5 and a first-aid, health and safety plan. The monitors are trained to react to any unforseen circumstance. Each activity abides by its own safety rules (safety vests on canoes, harness on ropes, etc), being oriented by professionals in each specific activity.

•First aid, emergency and evacuation?

There is always an instructor with first aid training and a first aid kit nearby. In case of need, there is an evacuation plan, individual or by group, to answer to emergencies or accidents.

The instructor in charge of camp is always reacheable.





FREQUENT QUESTIONS 2

•What are the safety mesaures?

The camp is private land with restricted access.

Young adventurers are identified at all times and can only enter and exit camp with their parents or in the transport back to Lisbon. A monitor goes with the group that opts for the shuttle to Lisbon, both to pick up the young adventurers and to deliver them back to the parents.

•What if my kid never did something similar?

Then he will love it! The camp starts with the basics and progresses in technique, which allows young adventurers to evolve in their own rithm and collaborate to the success of the team.

•Can they take cell phones?

There is signal and charging points available. But we can assure you: it will be so epic they won't even remember it exists!

•What happens if it rains?

In the rare chance of rainfall in July, the camp has a big roof where we can do most of the activities sheltered from the weather, be it rain or heavy heat. The program is flexible and we are able to Exchange activities within days, if needed.

•Are there toilets?

Yes, we have boys and girls bathrooms with hot showers..
